

ELECTION RESULTS WILL NOT IMPACT GLS' INSCOM CONTRACT STATUS

The US Election results will not cause interruption in our mission to provide the best quality linguists to the military forces and GLS employees will continue to assist the Iraqi people in the rebuilding of their country. In fact, GLS is pending approval of INSCOM's request to increase our contract by adding over 1300 linguists, bringing the total requirement to over 10,000 translators and interpreters.

GLS AND THE INSCOM CONTRACT STATUS

- An update to GLS President and CEO - Mr. Marks' October 27th message to GLS employees: INSCOM has formally provided GLS written notification of their intent to exercise the first Option Year – which extends our services beyond the Base Year through December 2009.
- On **30 October 2008** INSCOM issues GLS the contractual award fee – essentially the government's "report card" measuring our performance. GLS received the rating of *excellent* for our performance on the INSCOM Language contract for the first and second quarters.
- GLS' leadership and infrastructure is improving every day with the help and support of the INSCOM and U.S. Government. We are a Partnership.
- GLS is moving forward with its plans to invest and spend moneys to ensure uninterrupted services and to improve our infrastructure and business systems.
